Apple Trees (<i>Malus domestica</i>)**	An order consists of one Premier "Honeycrisp®" and one "Da Rosa®" Apple tree. The trees are bare root whips which are approximately 4' to 5' tall. Both varieties are well suited to the back yard grower. Premier Honeycrisp® is a complete tree sport of Honeycrisp that matures 3 weeks earlier. It shares many of the same attributes of the original and should not be considered a red strain. Rootstock is G-890. Da Rosa® is a highly russet-resistant selection of Golden Delicious. Fruit is firm, medium to large with a pink cheek developing as fruit approaches maturity. Root stock is Bud 118. Anchoring both of these trees will be beneficial.
Peach Tree (<i>Prunus persica</i>)	An order consists of ONE "Bounty" Peach tree. This variety has become an important commercial peach variety in the Mid-Atlantic region. Bounty fruit is very large and freestone with exceptional quality. The trees are vigorous, very productive and resistant to bacterial spot. They are self-fertile & do not require cross pollination.
Pear Tree (<i>Pryus</i>)	An order consists of ONE "Shenandoah" Pear tree. Shenandoah harvests approx. 3 weeks after Bartlett. Fruit size is large with traditional sub-acid pear flavor. Blight resistance is good. Stores very well for up to 5 months before breaking down. Rootstock is OHxF87. It does require additional pear tree for cross-pollination.
Blueberry Bushes (<i>Vaccinium</i>)**	An order consists of one "Chanticleer" (Early) and one "Bonus" (Late) blueberry bush obtained from a local berry farm. Plants are of bearing age and with care, will develop large flavorful berries. Select a sunny, well-drained site with sandy or loamy soil. You may need to add soil amendments.
Raspberry Plants (<i>Rubus idaeus</i>)	An order consists of 3 Raspberry transplants. ONE Black Raspberry, variety is Jewel. ONE Red Raspberry, variety is Latham and ONE Yellow Raspberry, variety is Fall Gold. These are small transplants that will grow to produce a delightful crop of raspberries for years to come. Everbearing, disease resistant and winter hardy.
Strawberry Plants (<i>Fragaria</i>)	An order consists of 25 strawberry vine plugs. The flavorful variety is "Seascape" a productive day-neutral variety. Highly successful for Northeastern growers for summer and fall production. Seascape will flower and fruit all season. The berries are large, prolific, and have good flavor when picked ripe.
Colorado Blue Spruce (<i>Picea pungens glauca</i>)	An order consists of 5, 2-year seedlings, 2-0, ranging in height from 5-10 inches. Colorado Blue Spruce is known to have stiff 1-inch-long silvery-blue to green needles and a uniform shape. Grows in ordinary soil with average moisture. A beautiful ornamental specimen, windbreak or colorful screen. Should be planted 6 feet apart.
Green Giant Pyramidal Arborvitae (<i>Thuja plicata x standishii</i>)	An order consists of 5, 4year Transplants ranging in height from 6-10 inches. Fast growing. Height 50-75 feet with a of width 10-20 feet. Dense, rich green foliage with a graceful fern-like texture. Use as a single specimen or easily managed hedge or screen. This variety has shown resistance to deer damage and browsing.
Red Oak (<i>Quercus rubra</i>)	An order consists of 5, 3year seedlings ranging in height from 18-24 inches. Fast growing to 60-70 feet with equal spread. The fastest growing of all oaks. Grows best in sandy to rich loamy soil in full sun. Tolerant of urban conditions such as salt, ozone and sulfur dioxide. Very valuable timber tree.
Silver Maple (<i>Acer saccharinum</i>)	An order consists of 5, 3year seedlings ranging in height from 1-2 feet. Very fast growing to a height of 50-70 feet. Grows best in moist, rich, well-drained soil. A very popular shade tree because of its fast growth and graceful habit. Native to the Eastern to Mid United States. The best tree for quick shade.
Purple Coneflower (<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>)	An order consists of 5, individually potted plants. A very robust perennial plant that grows to a height of 24-36" with a spread of 12-18". The flower petals range in color from purple to lavender. Blooms all summer and into autumn. Plant in full sun or partial shade. Maintenance free. A butterfly favorite. Stunning in mass plantings.
Deciduous Azaleas (<i>Pentanthera</i>)	An order consists of one Deciduous Azalea plant" in a one-gallon pot. You pick your color choice of Red, White Pink or Yellow. They are shrubs with long leading branches, attractive green foliage and brilliant colorful flowers in late spring and summer. Deciduous Azaleas lose their leaves in Autumn and Winter. Grown best in part sun, they will tolerate full sun if kept slightly moist, otherwise an acidic, well-drained soil is preferred. Grown locally.
Northeast Annual & Perennial Wildflower Mix	Seed mixture is very colorful mix that provides up to five years of color and attracts a variety of birds and butterflies. Mixture is ERNMX-168. Majority of mix reaches 2-5 feet at maturity. Seed coverage: 7-10 pounds per acre; 1 ounce per 388 sq. ft.
